Health Centre: Clinic 41	Clinic 41 offers full general practice (GP) and nursing services for Unitec students and staff. We offer affordable and fully accredited healthcare, including confidential health advice and treatment, and male and female doctors and nurses. We are a member of the Auckland PHO (primary health organisation) and accredited by the Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners. All consultations are confidential. You can drop in to see a nurse at any time, but you may have to wait. Please make an appointment to see a doctor. You pay less for health services if you register with us as your primary health organisation. Community Service Card holders pay less for some healthcare and prescriptions. If you receive a Student Allowance, you will automatically receive a Community Services Card. Most students are eligible for a Community Services Card. If you need a prescription you can get it from the Unimart on-campus pharmacy. There is a 10% discount for Unitec staff and students.
