Unitec Screen Arts grad **Amberley Aumua** is one of nine female Pacific filmmakers who co-wrote and directed *Vai*, a film about female empowerment that spans the breadth of the Pacific telling the story of one woman's life in eight separate moments from the perspective of eight different Pacific Island cultures. Vai was filmed in seven Pacific countries: Fiji, Tonga, Solomon Islands, Kuki Airani (Cook Islands), Samoa, Niue and Aotearoa (New Zealand) and will be released in New Zealand cinemas next week on 4 April. The film's world premiere was on 8 February at Berlin's CineStar Imax, as part of the 2019 Berlin Film Festival.
