Walls That Talk: Ngā Pātū Kōrero, is a documentary theatre project with the heavy contribution of Unitec acting tutor **Pedro Ilgenfritz**. Led by applied theatre specialist Dr Rand Hazou, the theatre project provided a creative and therapeutic forum for prisoners to reflect on and better understand their life experiences both inside and beyond the prison walls. Dr Hazou says access to the arts in prison is a human rights issue. "We need to be supporting an engagement with the arts in prison because corrections is a system that often dehumanises people," he says.
