Highlights / Achievements

Exceptions

- a) How are we closing the loops on exceptions raised previously in these reports? In particular:
 - Missing grades, has this been addressed and if so by who and which committee should it be raised at?
 - Compulsory attendance at strategy 'roadshow'. How are we reassured that this message is promulgated throughout the organisation?
 - NPS verbatim data how are we responding to the student feedback and through which committees is this being addressed.
- b) As an outcome of conversations re: Priority Action 3.1 above, we identified that students interested in study often have their enrolment process stalled or stopped due to not being able to afford a birth certificate.

Recommended Actions and relevant committee

Recommend that:

- a) Te Whare Wānanga o Wairaka purchase birth certificates on behalf of enrolling students who cannot afford to purchase themselves.
- b) Academic Board endorses the operational plan (see link) for the Māori Success Strategy and the associated dashboard.
- c) Academic Board endorses the publishing of the operational plan dashboard to the Nest for our wider whānau to access.
