Purpose

The Under 25s Success Strategy has been designed to support how we work with our young people, their communities and across our wider Unitec whānau. With a renewed focus on Under 25s as a priority group, this strategy has been aligned to The Unitec Renewal Strategy (2019 – 2022), to ensure we manaaki the success of our Under 25 students and their communities.

The strategy takes a strengths based approach to ensure our Under 25s are partners and contributors to their own learning and success and identify our roles in supporting this. An institutional partnership approach has been employed, reflective of the whole of institute commitment to improve the success of all students.

Led by the voices of our Under 25s, communities, stakeholders and partners to create a strategy with the purpose to provide Unitec with institution wide initiatives, that align ways of working together to ensure the success of our young people. Under the **three priorities** of **Transition**, **Reputation and Retention**, we have identified key strategic areas of focus and a series of actions to increase engagement, success, completion and participation rates for Under 25s at Unitec.

Background

Questions and responses that arose during consultation

Q. Were the United priorities taken into account during the development of the strategy?

A. Each priority area has been mapped against the four key priorities to ensure alignment, as are the actions that are proposed to sit within the Draft Operations Plan.

Q. As the Māori and Pacific Success Strategies seek endorsement from Rūnanga and Fono respectively, will we be seeking endorsement from another ITP's Youth Guarantee or Under 25s office?

A. We are confident that we have taken a well-informed, collaborative approach across a number of internal and external stakeholders that include specialists in the Under 25 and Youth Sector.

Q. Have Māori and Pacific students been taken into consideration during the development of this strategy?

A. Each priority area has been mapped against the four key priorities to ensure alignment, as are the actions that are proposed to sit within the Draft Operations Plan.

Q. Have International students been taken into consideration during the development of this strategy?

A. The International Student Support Team have been involved in reviewing and shaping the strategy. The Director International Success has been involved in discussions regarding the Transition actions proposed to sit within the Draft Operations Plan.

Q. There is a chance the Youth Development Strategy may be reviewed in the future as it is felt it currently does not truly show partnership with the Treaty of Waitangi. A recent review has been undertaken of it, would you consider using that?

A. If the reviewed one had been approved as the new national Youth Development Strategy already then yes. However it hasn't, and we are using Te Noho Kotahitanga in partnership



with the Youth Development Strategy Aotearoa which is our partnership document that incorporates the principles of The Treaty of Waitangi, The two working together.

Q. Does this strategy include all institutional retention initiatives for Under 25s?

A. This strategy has a number of retention actions proposed to sit within the Draft Operations Plan, however there will be additional actions proposed to sit within the Student Success Retention Framework

Questions were also raised regarding the timing of some activity and its impact on other operational aspects of the institution. This feedback has been taken on board and all dates within the proposed Draft Operations Plan will be agreed on in partnership with respective partners.

Resource required

The Director United Pathways College and Students Under 25 Success will be putting forwarded a resource request for one additional staff member to provide administrative and operational student support for Vocational Pathway and Workshop Activity. This additional position will free up workload for other key operational roles within the team, to develop and action additional activity within the proposed Draft Operations Plan.
