

Unitec Dance's Year 2 choreographic showcase **coLAB 2** came to an end last Saturday night after a six-show season from 4-7 September. Two of the shows were sold out, opening and closing night, and overall we had an audience of 409 patrons with an average audience of 68.2 per show (seating capacity was 95). This year's show was a success with our total gross revenue exceeding revenue from last year's show. Although a shorter show this year due to our smaller Year 2 cohort, we received wide praise for the quality of the works from industry, schools and patrons. 
