**Goal 1:** Build strong partnering relationships across United with a focus on students and empowering staff in Health and Safety

# Objectives:

- 1. Embed a positive Health and Safety culture through partnering, coaching and collaborative networks both internally and externally (industry, communities, networks).
- 2. Ensure all staff understand and demonstrate the values of Te Noho Kotahitanga by partnering with Maia in the implementation of the Māori Success Strategy.
- 3. Support the implementation of Priority Group Success Strategies.
- 4. Continue to improve staff engagement in the Health and Safety space; gather feedback through regular, ongoing staff engagement/pulse surveys, Health and Safety reporting, and implement action items in a timely manner.
- 5. Build the organisational competence and confidence to understand and demonstrate 'best practice' Health and Safety.

Goal 2: Build the capability of all staff to support the success of our students

## Objectives:

- 1. Embed a whole-of-organisation approach to health and safety.
- 2. Continue to embed and enhance 'best practice' health and safety practices to contribute toward a Category 1 Culture of Excellence.
- 3. Support the ongoing and continuous development of teacher capability, particularly in high risk safety areas, to ensure academic quality and support student success.

Goal 3: Ensure a resilient Health and Safety Management System

# Objectives:

- 1. Develop and implement a robust Assurance programme for all Health and Safety risks to support continuous improvement.
- 2. Foster the development of self-evaluation & reflective practices to support the return to Category One.
- 3. Use the Safe 365 tool to;
  - i. assess the current Health and Safety system to give a holistic view of the organisation
  - ii. identify areas to improve
  - iii. implement action items
- 4. Use the full functionality of Vault to support the development of a reporting culture.
- 5. Provide tools, resources & reporting to enable managers and staff to be accountable and to meet compliance requirements.
- 6. Improve quality, visibility and use of data to inform business decisions and to ensure a sustainable resource model and structure for the future.
