Schedule #: Hōtaka Whakarerekē O Ngā Āhuatanga Ako | Modified Programmes of Study

<A modified programme of study may be created to allow a specific group of students under a specific circumstance to meet the graduate profile and achieve the award of the qualification by undertaking a different set of courses from the standard ones noted above. Modified programmes of study which are designed specifically for transitioning students from old qualifications to new qualifications should be noted here, or if there are a large number, in a schedule at the end of these regulations>

- 9. 1 Modified Programme of Study for Beijing Dance Academy To be awarded the Bachelor of Performing and Screen Arts (Contemporary Dance) under this modified programme of study, students must successfully complete the following:
 - a. Students will be granted credit recognition of 120 Level 5 credits toward the BPSA
 Contemporary Dance major for successful completion of Years 1 & 2 (equivalent Level 5
 course work) of the Bachelor of Arts (BDA) Creative Performance Pathway at the Beijing Dance
 Academy;
 - b. Students will complete 180 credits in the following courses at Unitec:

Schedule #: Additional Transfer Arrangements from Other Programmes or Courses

<Where courses from another programme (New Zealand or Internationally recognised qualification) can be automatically credited against courses in this programme, then transfer arrangements may be established to streamline the administrative process. Articulation arrangements and rules for New Zealand qualifications must be created and approved by the Relevant Academic Authority. International articulation agreements must be entered into with the International Education Organisation and must include evidence of the mapping of courses and outcomes and must be formally approved via a contract>

A. Transfer from NZ Diploma programmes

For graduates of the Level 6 NZ Diploma in Construction (Construction Management and Quantity Surveying) or the NZ Diploma in Architectural Technology the following entry pathways will be available.

- a. For a completed Diploma, in the discipline of a BCons major, a student will be given 210 credits and entry to the programme at a point appropriate to their chosen major.
- b. For a completed Diploma, in the discipline of a BCons major and completed with above average academic performance, a student will be given 210 credits, plus the opportunity to gain 30 credits via two 15-credit courses (CONS6601 Transition Studies 1 and CONS6602 Transition

- Studies 2). These 30 credits must be achieved before entry to the third year of the degree.
- c. For a completed Diploma, together with significant and appropriate industry experience, a student will be given 240 credits and entry to the third year of the degree.

Transition from other Level 6 diploma programmes in construction and infrastructure areas require a similar pattern of credits on a discretionary basis. In assessing whether to grant discretionary admission the primary focus will be on the applicant's level of preparedness for study at the required level.
