The play is based on the 'Wairau Massacre' which was the first significant armed conflict between Māori and British settlers after the signing of Tiriti o Waitangi. *The Wairau Affray* still ripples through history for local iwi Ngāti Toa almost 177 years after it happened. *The Wairau Affray* has seven shows staging at the Suter Theatre during the Nelson Heritage Festival between April 15 and April 19 and will be staged again in Blenheim in June.
