There needs to be more evidence relating to the Tertiary Evaluative Indicators. Examples of regular reports that could be included are below. It is noted that some of the reports can be sourced through Power BI, which is awesome, but we need to be better across these as a governance committee.

- Regular review of institutional EPIs

- Staffing reports (e.g. academic vs allied, turnover, percentage change from 2015-current)
- Student services usage report
- Industry Advisory meeting schedule and report
- Number of SACs submitted each month
- Summary of attendance records
- Student complaint record
