Overview

General Committee Health Check

This committee has been working well this month in dealing with program compliance (PEP's, Monitors response etc.) along with the student issues (COG's, DEF's and Misconduct investigations.

However, timing of meetings has often meant that it has been hard to establish a quorum and hence many of the planned meetings have become e-meetings. Whilst this approach does move agenda items through the process of approvals it does negate the ability of the committee to reflect and debate the broader issues facing the programs.

Recent membership changes go some way to reducing this going forward, however we are still in the process of recruiting both student and external staff members to the committee.

Progress against 3 (max.) key actions

This last cycle has been primarily focussed on operation activities of PEP's, degree monitoring responses and student issues for semester 1. All of which are now completed.

Unitec has been heavily involved in the NZDE to BEngTech L5/L6 alignment project at a national level and this is now largely complete ready for submission to NZBED in April.

Priorities (3-5) for cycle

- i. Alignment Project L5/L6 courses
- ii. Maori/PI engagement in the BEngTech
- iii. Monitoring the outcomes for students of off-campus delivery of courses during lockdown
- iv. Monitoring of actions for 'at risk students'

Risk management

A risk analysis spreadsheet has been developed by the APM and to date no high risks or extreme risks have been identified

Quality Reporting

Programme Evaluation (PEP)

The PAQC rated the PEP for BETMG overall as (good) primarily based on the following key factors

- i) Delivery, Compliance and governance is a particular strength of this program.
- ii) Areas highlighted in the monitors report for improvement within the program signalled actions to be addressed in 2020 by the program.



ii) SCC rate and Maori engagement and participation within the program remains low, although several initiatives have begun in 2020 to support Maori and PI students along with encouraging progression from NZDE to the Degree

The PAQC rated the PEP for NZDE overall as (good) primarily based on the following key factors

- i) Delivery, Compliance and governance is a particular strength of this program.
- ii) Areas highlighted as a concern is low pass rates in nationally set exams in the first semester of the Diploma. This raised concerns over the setting of these exams and the need for Unitec to be involved in the moderation and setting of these. In addition to this the program would benefit (as we are the largest provider) if we had a larger voice in the NZBED governance (particularly in Civil).

The PAQC rated the PEP for NZDS overall as (excellent) primarily based on the following key factors

- i) Delivery, Compliance and governance is a particular strength of this program.
- ii) This program continues to be highly respected by Industry and delivers 100% employment for our graduates

Degree Monitoring

The response to the 2019 Monitors report was tabled and approved by the PAQC. This report had 13 recommendations. Of the 13 recommendations 11 were agreed to and placed in the action plan, of the remaining 2

- i) 24hr access to Labs, this was deemed not possible after discussion with FM
- ii) Poster sessions for final project presentation was rejected by Civil as not logistically possible due to the large number of students, however is currently done in Electrical.

Programme Review

Currently both NZBED and NZBEngTech are undertaking an alignment between the NZDE and BEngTech. United is an active member of this process and it is now nearing completion. The PAQC has been following the progress of this national project.

Summary Information & Compliance Overview


The following are summaries collated and populated by TKK in collaboration with the Chair and APMs.

The PAQC noted and approved all changes of grades and recommendations from the grades approval committees for the three programs as listed below. A 14 DEF grades from 1194 in the civil majors of both BEngTech and NZDE have been discussed and expected to be resolved at the completion of 1202. All Electrical program completions where accepted however 5 Civil applications were declined, 2 of which have been requested to investigate the credit shortfall.
