### Overview

### **General Committee Health Check**

What is going well?

Completion and review of PEP reports for the BAT and NZCEE programmes.

What improvements can be made?

Inadequate representation at PAQC meetings. Lack of attendees. Need to review committee membership and recruit student representatives.

What support is needed (actions required)?

Recruit new representatives on to the PAQC committee.

## Progress against 3 (max.) key actions

The previous cycle of the PAQC was focused on completion of finalised PEP documents for the NZCEE and BAT programmes. PEPs have now been finalised and approved by the PAQC. Updated action plans are included in the relevant PEPs.

## Priorities (3-5) for cycle

- Tracking of student engagement: a significant issue in the NZCEE programme is the low course completion rate, and a lack of data regarding the reasons for this. The Learner Outreach Programme will be a major component in tracking (and hopefully improving) student engagement and course completion.
- Planning and tracking of internal and external moderation: ensuring that moderation plans are up to date and are being implemented.
- Strengthen industry engagement through direct consultation and Industry Advisory Committees. These committees exist but recent meetings have been cancelled. Industry engagement is essential for ensuring that our graduates are meeting the needs of industry.

### Risk management

A risk analysis spreadsheet has been developed by the APM and to date no high risks or extreme risks have been identified. The risk analysis spreadsheet can be found





The NZCEE PEP was given an overall rating of 'Good' for quality of self-evaluation. Student success rate (SCC) at 70.7% is lower than the Unitec target but the key problems associated with this have been identified and corrective action has been initiated. Low student retention between the two semesters is of most concern. Identification of 'at risk' students and follow up through the Learner Outreach Programme will attempt to address this issue.

The BAT PEP was given an overall rating of 'Excellent'. This rating was discussed by the PAQC. The rating for most (4 out of 5) of the individual criteria within the PEP was 'Good', with only one criteria (How effectively are students supported and involved in their learning?) being rated as 'Excellent'. Representatives from the BAT programme on the PAQC were insistent that overall the evaluation of the programme should be excellent. The BAT programme has high student success rate (88.3%), but needs to address issues around facilities and resources, and to improve communication with industry stakeholders (reinvigorate the IAC).

## **Degree Monitoring**

A degree monitoring report for the BAT programme was received 11 June 2019. The report provided a list of 13 recommendations around the areas of:

- facilities and resources
- support for international students and priority learners
- industry engagement

The PAQC prepared a response to the monitors report in 2019 that identified specific actions. The Response to Monitors Report document was endorsed by the PAQC.

### **Programme Review**

NZCEE programme review has commenced with 1 FTE allocated to conduct the review. The aim of the review is to streamline the programme by removing duplication across individual courses, and to identify and fill any gaps that are identified in the programme. It is expected that the review will be completed by June 2020 and that applications for approval of recommended changes will be submitted soon after this date. The Skills Organisation is concurrently reviewing the NZ Certificate in Electrical Engineering Level 3 qualification and is also intending to develop a programme that will lead to the qualification.


#### Grades

A list of missing grades for semesters 1192 and 1194 was received by the PAQC. Due to lack of representation from the NZCEE team at the meeting it was agreed that these would be dealt with at the next meeting. In the interim, the missing grades are being investigated by the Electrical Engineering/Applied Technology administrator. The two DEF grades are from the Bachelor of Applied Technology programme. Student needs to be externally moderated before grades can be released.
