## Introduction

This is a memo to report on all activities this month that have contributed to the achievement of the actions of the Pacific Success Strategy and Pacific Success Operations Plan.

## Highlights / Achievements

- The members of the Pacific leadership and Pacific support teams held their Internal Evaluation Reviews on the 4<sup>th</sup> June. All the staff walked away from the IER sessions felling good about the sessions and receiving very useful feedback for further improvement.
- The Pacific Centre Team were all back on campus from June the 15<sup>th</sup>. The team will continue to work both on and away from campus with two days of the week with the full team on campus and three days with 1-2 members per day working remotely off campus.
- Pacific EPI data for 2019 shows that Pacific learners have met all the step goals set for 2019 in the build up to parity by 2022.


