2019 Unitec acting grad **Kauri Williams** (pictured) has scored himself a part in Maori Television's bilingual series *Ahikāroa* which follows the trials and tribulations of urban rangatahi. He has been filming series two of *Ahikāroa* for the last few months and plays Whatukura McGregor, a Maori police officer/iwi liaison. The TV series has some strong Unitec connections featuring a number of Maori and Pacific grads: Acting grad **Tomai Ihaia** was cast in Series 1 while grads **Tainui Tukiwaho** (cowriter) and **Joan James** (Costume Assistant) were also involved. Harris are co-directors while Harris is also on the storyliner team with fellow grad and NZ comedian/actor, **Kura Forrester**. Screen Arts grads **Nikora Edwards** and **Gabriel Muller** are both sound recordists. More here.

It is with great sadness that I announce the death of my mentor, **Kristin Linklater**, who died at age 84 at her home in Housegarth, Quoyloo, Orkney in the early hours of Friday June 5th. Kristin was an extraordinary, inspirational, world

renowned Voice
Teacher and Author,
who worked with
generations of
performers, artists,
teachers, and people
from all walks of life
from across the globe
to Free their Natural
Voice. I first met
Kristin's work when I
studied acting in South
Australia in the late



1990's, and had the great privilege of training with her in the UK in 2011-12 to become designated in her method. I went to Orkney last year with three other designated teachers to assist her to run her Teacher Training, and will forever cherish the memories of that incredible opportunity to watch a master of art at work. Kristin's legacy will continue to uplift and inspire many generations to come. I am privileged to have trained under her excellent tutelage and to have called her my mentor. I owe her a great debt of gratitude, and will continue to strive for excellence in my practice, and for my students, in tribute to her. Vale Kristin. May Flights of Angels sing thee to thy rest.

Kristin Linklater Obituary

Remarkable voice coach whose transformational methods left a profound effect on some of the biggest names of stage and screen.



For more than 50 years Linklater inspired actors, singers, preachers, lawyers: anyone who needed to speak clearly and with confidence. They were encouraged to discover the potential of their body, and often the hidden depths of their personality. The voice, she said, was a human instrument, waiting to be liberated. Her book Freeing the Natural Voice became a bible in the theatre world, and its companion volume Freeing Shakespeare's Voice has influenced actors across the world to speak the bard's lines freely.

For actors such as Bill Murray, Donald

Sutherland (a lifelong friend), Sigourney Weaver, Patrick Stewart, Mary Tyler Moore and many others, Linklater was a life coach as well as a teacher of voice. Linklater was a regular speaker at the World Economic Forum in Davos. She helped train actors in China and Taiwan, and she taught at the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Central School in London. Just a week before her death she delivered the keynote speech, online, to a drama conference in Shanghai. In a Rome theatre last year she had an audience of 600 standing to do her exercises. Perhaps most remarkably, after teaching for 50 years in America, where she had been professor of drama at Columbia University in New York, she returned at the age of 77 to her native Orkney, bought a crumbling farmhouse at Housegarth, and established a voice teaching centre, raising £200,000 to build a modern studio and accommodation.

At the time of her death she had welcomed 1,200 students and trained 239 teachers.

Interviewed for the local paper, she said: "I don't understand the word retirement. I'm going to teach until I drop." She leaves her son, and three grandchildren; one of them, named Iris in memory of Iris Warren, was born the day after her death.
