

Unitec dance grad **losefa Enari**, the founder and artistic director of Pacific Dance New Zealand, was made a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to Pacific dance, in Monday's announcement of this year's Queen's Birthday Honours list. Through PDNZ, he had been integral in organising a number of national events including the Pacific Dance Artist in Residence, the Pacific Dance Choreographic Lab, various symposiums, educational and community programmes, and the annual Pacific Dance Festival. successful in applying for this year's Bold Innovators scholarship and will be supported from July on to take her work from her MCP thesis further to start a type foundry in Auckland incorporating her development in unique typefaces. "My vision is to create Auckland's first Type Foundry to design, develop and commercialise typefaces. Focusing on creating unique Aotearoa typefaces to explore not only our culture but for these typefaces to be used in our diverse community today. Establishing this Type

Foundry will encourage other design creatives to learn the lost art of Typography," says Jaime, who draws inspiration from her Maori (Tainui)/Chinese heritage.
