
Unitec School of Creative Industries - Weekly Newsletter: 8 June 2020

Running concurrently in July, MCP student **Sheryl Campbell** is completing her Masters with an exhibition in the exhibition space of Building 76 and launching her

photobook *Droplet*. This exhibition is also part of the Auckland Festival of Photography. Sheryl works with current events involving problematic sexuality in New Zealand and make photographs that question gendered sexual norms. *Droplet* examines a case that came to light in February 2018 when several students, who were on



internships at a top law firm, reported having been sexually assaulted by senior partners. More <u>here</u>.

Screen Arts directing tutor **Katherine McRae** recently won three awards for her short documentary for Loading Doc's called *Water Baby*:

The film has gone on to have over seven million views online and is available on the <u>Loading Doc's</u> website, TVNZ on Demand, Air NZ inflight and was on Rialto earlier in the year and will be on Maori Television in June. Katherine and her

producer Migiwa Ozawa are preparing to make a feature documentary on similar themes of birth and ocean protection.

SAW-SEE_SEE-SAW is a new exhibition which runs 11-28 June 2020 at the sancgallery.com at 4d/30 Upper Queen Street, Auckland CBD and features work by Georgia Arnold, Hannah Ireland and **Tyrone Te Waa** (current MCP student/BCE grad). Unitec grads were among the recipients of the New Zealand Film Commission's (NZFC) latest round of funding of \$1.2 million awarded to 33 companies, through its business and slate development schemes: BOOST, BOOST UP and He Ara:

Multinesia awarded \$50,000

Led by filmmakers Karin William, Jeremiah Tauamiti and Unitec acting/screen arts grad **Hanelle Harris**. Their aim is to create, manage and produce award winning projects for stage and screen. Brown Sugar Apple Grant gets \$25,000

Brown Sugar Apple Grant is the production company of Unitec grads, **Kerry Warkia** and **Kiel McNaughton** who have forged a distinctive voice and innovative content that tell stories from perspectives of people-of-colour, underrepresented voices and stories of the South Pacific experience.
