

Creative Industries invites you to the opening of GALLERY ONE in its new space in Building 76. The new venue will open with two stunning exhibitions that were conceived as part of the Auckland Festival of Photography 2020. These very

exhibitions offer a curious insight into the problematics surrounding communication, memory, interpretation, experience and the referential from different positions behind the lens. **Sheryl Campbell'**s *Droplet* is a culmination of her Master in Creative Practice here at Unitec. Operating in both still photography and moving image, Campbell draws attention to the complexities surrounding feminist issues through a questioning of harmful sexual behaviour.
