Overview

Much of the last three months has seen the PAQC focus on operational issues after the return of students to on-campus delivery in particular assessment (Examinations). Membership of the committee has also posed an issue but has been resolved in this quarter however meeting timings still often results in a quorum being difficult to achieve.

General Committee Health Check

What is going well?

The committee continues to effectively address issues around stakeholder engagement addressing issues with NZBED and NZBEngTech. In particular the national alignment of the NZDE and NZBEngTech is now nearing completion along with the delayed national examinations in the NZDE.

Progress against 3 (max.) key actions

Unitec has been heavily involved in the NZDE to BEngTech L5/L6 alignment project at a national level and this is now largely complete with minor issues in the electrical major to be resoved

Priorities (3-5) for cycle

- i. Alignment Project L5/L6 courses
- ii. Maori/PI engagement in the BEngTech
- iii. Monitoring the outcomes for students of off-campus delivery of courses during lockdown.
- iv. Monitoring of actions for 'at risk students'

Priority Group Strategies

Process

Both Schools involved in these programs have placed significant effort in this area with in particular LOP's being put in place to engage with at risk students. Analysis of early assessments have also aided in the identification of students requiring assistance

Outcomes

Due to the timing of Examiners meetings, delayed by pushing back of national exams, we are yet to see any analysis of the effects of LOP for semester 1. This should be available at the next meeting of the PAQC.

Risk management

Summary



In conjunction with NZBED all national exams where delayed by 2 weeks and undertaken in July. This gave students the opportunity for additional face to face delivery after the alert level 2 was achieved. A flow on from this was a delayed start (by 1 week) of semester two for these programs. NZBED has also timetabled resit examinations in September for students whose performance was impaired by Covid-19.


