
Two Bachelor of Creative Enterprise students were among the winners at this year's Eden Arts Art School Award announced last Wednesday, 5 August at Webb's Auction House, Mt Eden. **Jimmy Ma'ia'i** (middle) and **Kim Lu** (below right) received Highly Commended Awards for their respective works. Ma'ia'i's mixed media entry *Samoasonite* was inspired by polypropylene bags commonly used by Pacific islanders for air travel, hence the term, Samoan suitcase. Lu's photographic entry *Silent Echo* is a "quiet reflection on the enigmas of the world and that which is not yet known". This year's event saw 20 of the best student works from Elam, Unitec, AUT and Whitecliffe in a single exhibition. Also representing Unitec this year was **Jacob Hamilton, Blessilda Cabaloza** and **Chang Lee.**







United acting grad (2017) Sa'ane Green (pictured right) is part of an all-Tongan core cast starring in the first Tongan bilingual drama web series funded by New Zealand On Air as part of its Pasifika and Asian Storytellers Initiative. Brutal Lives - Mo'ui Faingata'a is created and written by director Vela Manusaute and producer **Sandra** Kailahi, who is a Unitec Masters of International Communications grad. The series follows the life of former boxer Soane 'The Shark' Valu who returns to South Auckland from America after the passing of his father. Green plays daughter Lupe. 

Leung has featured before as a student in the gallery in two group exhibitions in 2018. Leung presented his first solo exhibition, Zeninimalism, in 2017 at TSB Bank Wallace Arts Centre | Pah Homestead. Born in Auckland in 1994, of Chinese/Malaysian background and raised in a Chinese/Malaysian household,


