

For close to twenty years, Unitec acting grad **Tainui Tukiwaho** has been a prolific maker in Aotearoa's creative arts sector, perhaps most notably in the world of

theatre where he wears many hats: actor, writer, producer, director. But as of late, the hat he enjoys spending most of his time wearing is as Te Taha Wairua at Te Pou-Auckland's Māori home of theatre. Tukiwaho, a graduate of Te Taumata Toi-a-lwi's ART Venture



programme, founded Te Pou alongside a collective of other Māori theatre-makers back in April 2015 and it is his leadership that has seen Te Pou through the past five years and supported multiple Māori artists to make their mark on the national theatre scene. Read more here.

stand-up comedian. He took a leap of faith after working in retail for several years after graduating. The Unitec Dance programme has announced a change to their dress code, including moving away from traditional attire in ballet classes. Students are now free to choose what they wear to their ballet class (within a set of guidelines), rather than wearing the



pink or black tights and leotard commonly associated with practising ballet. The move, reflecting the value of Ngākau Māhaki - Respect, was made to support students to reflect their gender diversity and cultural identity through their clothes - a perfect example. Dance lecturer **Paul Young** said that the traditional gendered ballet uniform reflects a view of binary gender, doesn't adequately accommodate people of colour and can be uncomfortable for students who don't have a background in ballet.
