Congratulations to our Unitec alumni who were among this year's Arts Laureates announced last week. For the past 20 years, the Arts Foundation has been

acknowledging the country's most outstanding arts practitioners across every genre. Laureates are bestowed on either someone who's made an indelible mark on the country (and often beyond our shores) or an acknowledgement of the potential to have an enduring and impactful creative career. Dance alumnus (1998), Moss Te **<u>Ururangi Patterson</u>** (front left) was the recipient of the Burr/Tatham Trust Award. With more than two decades as a professional dancer under his belt, there are few dance companies in this country that Patterson's skills haven't graced. His passion for te ao Māori comes through strongly in his choreography, with celebrated works touring here and overseas.



While drawing deeply on his rich ancestry, Patterson is a leading exponent of contemporary dance, something he will continue to drive after establishing TOHU dance theatre.

Tanu Gago left Unitec at the end of 2009 with a Bachelor of Performing and Screen Arts majoring in Writing & Directing. He went on to co-found the queer collective **FAFSWAG**, artists and activists committed to social change through arts and innovation. <u>FAFSWAG</u> are the first collective to be awarded an Arts Laureate award for interdisciplinary arts.
