3.1. Graduate Survey Report

The Committee noted that when the Report was presented to Te Poari Whai Kounga, a Working Group was endorsed to address the recommendations within it.

The Committee noted:

- Graduates in Employment, further Study or Combined (GESC) dropped by 3.6% from 2019, fuelled mainly by a 7.5% drop in % Employed (Covid impact) which was mitigated by a 3.9% increase in % Higher Study.
- The 2020 % GESC continued a decreasing trend over the past 5 years and was particularly impacted by Lockdowns in 2020.
- That compared with other publicly available data, United has the shortest time between the date of graduation and the date of running the survey.
- The Graduate Net Promoter Score improved significantly compared to the previous three years.
- Outstanding results for Teaching Effectiveness from the School of Environmental and Animal Sciences and the School of Community Studies.

- Outstanding results for Qualification Relevant to Employment from the School of Healthcare and Social Practice.
- Programme Evaluation Reports will provide context for some of the significant changes in various metrics for individual Schools.
- Considerations could be made to adjust the timing to improve response rates and align with employment patterns of different discipline areas.

The Committee noted how agile Teaching Staff had been in adjusting their teaching practice during Lockdowns. It also noted how the summary of teacher reflections highlighted the need for significant on-going support for the development of confidence and capability in the design and facilitation of remote teaching; support which will be essential for the institution to be prepared for the possibility of further lockdowns and to support transition from emergency remoted teaching to pre-planned/designed blended learning.

ACTION:

- Executive Director of Ako and the Manager of Te Puna Ako to consider prioritizing blended learning for compulsory teacher professional development for 2021.
- James Oldfield to continue planning with the Te Puna Ako team, and to consult with the Student Council and Student Representatives, with a view to presenting a plan at the next Ako Ahimura meeting for working with teachers to increase confidence and capability in blended learning.
