### 11.EPI, STUDENT COURSE SURVEY, AND GRADUATE SURVEY DATA FOR THE PROGRAMMES REPRESENTED AT PGRSC

- Data from the dashboards given below were shared with the committee for their review and discussion
  - **1. Student Education Performance Indicator (EPI) Dashboard-2019** *Recommended to be shared yearly in September for the previous year*
  - **2. Student Course Survey Dashboard-S1, 2020**Recommended to be shared half-yearly in April and September for the previous semester
  - **3. Graduate Survey Dashboard-S1,2020**Recommended to be shared half-yearly in April and September for the previous semester







- Assoc Prof Liz Rainsbury recorded that the SCC stats in Student EPI dashboard for Applied Business is not correct as it includes MAP overall records rather than only for MAP-PA.
- Assoc Prof Liz Rainsbury also commented that there is a variance between qualification completion rate between Māori and non-Māori, and Pacific and non-Pacific, which indicate the importance of our Māori and Pacific Scholarships, supporting priority group students.
- Assoc Prof Helen Gremillion commented that Michelle Sun from Te Korowai Kahorangi
  has been very helpful in creating separate data for Social Practice which include
  unique features.

#### 12. GUIDELINES AND TOR FOR POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMMES SCHOLARSHIPS

 Assoc Prof Helen Gremillion commented that there are three different minimum grade criterion between Industry, Priority and all Programme based postgraduate scholarships, hence it would be useful for the committee to have a look at all the scholarship guidelines including Māori and Pacific scholarships to check for continuity.

- The committee decided that the students can apply for the scholarships before enrolment, and can be accepted for a scholarship subject to enrolment. The scholarship will only be activated after the proof of enrolment is provided.
- ACTION: Hamza Qazi and Assoc Prof Helen Gremillion to review the postgraduate scholarship guidelines and templates to incorporate the change related to the requirement to provide the enrolment evidence.

- Assoc Prof Liz Rainsbury commented that growth targets should not only be linked to the target EFTS, but it should also be related to 2020 budgeted EFTS for the programme and the difference in the programme operational environment.
- ACTION: Assoc Prof Marcus Williams to seek the growth/target EFTS for the year 2021 from the head of Schools for the Postgraduate Programmes, keeping the PGRSC member in the loop.

#### 14. SCHOLARSHIP ALLOCATION FOR THE YEAR 2021

 A memo for approval was shared by Assoc Prof Marcus Williams for the committee to decide on the allocation of funds for the various Postgraduate Scholarship for the year 2021.

- The committee discussed and decided that the allocation for MBus would not be required as the new master's programme in the School of Applied Business would be starting soon.
- The committee decided that the \$7000 from MBus can be allocated to the MArcP to better reflect the 60% of all level 9 programmes that the MArcP represents.
- Since the primary aim for the Programme scholarships is to grow the enrolments at the postgraduate level, the committee decided that the allocation of \$16000 for the MOst programme is not fulfilling this aim, because it is closing down. To support the above decision and to provide ample time for the programme to review its student support funding source, the committee voted on various options and supported the idea of giving scholarship of \$8000 for 2021 and \$8000 for 2022 and then no scholarships going forward. The decision was unanimous, except for Victor Grbic, Caroline Malthus and Helen Vea who abstained from voting.

• **ACTION:** Assoc Prof Marcus Williams to inform Marketing about the postgraduate scholarship allocations for the Master programme.
