Great news for BCE graduand **John Crouch** who was selected by Sanderson Contemporary Art Gallery for their annual Emerging Artists exhibition in Newmarket, Auckland, 26 January to 28 February 2021. The exhibition supports



promising new talent showcasing a collection of works from recent graduates giving viewers insight into the practices of these talented artists, whose careers are ones to watch. With the many uncertainties of 2020, students spent much of their university year in isolation, confined to web-based learning and the materials at hand. 2020 pushed these artists to unconventionally explore their creativity and art practise. Crouch's work *Penina* (acrylic on MDF board, 1200mm x 1200mm) was
