Subject Director Pacific Success Report

Introduction

This is a memo to report on all activities this month that have contributed to the achievement of the actions of the Pacific Success Strategy and Pacific Success Operations Plan.

Highlights / Achievements

- Pacific Enrolments are up 13% from last year.
- First year retention of Pacific students climbed from 60.4% in 2019 to 66.9% in 2020. The increase in enrolments this year will hopefully see these rates continue to climb.
- The percentage of fulltime Pacific enrolments have climbed from 46% in 2020 to 76% in 2021.
- There has been an increase in male Pacific enrolment from 41.2% in semester one 2020 to 53.8% in semester one 2021.
- The development of a Pacific Postgraduate Fono 'Matala He Toume'.








1.4 Ensure Schools are supported and resourced to take the necessary actions to ensure Pacific students are supported appropriately and succeeding in their studies.









2.5 Grow Pacific staff numbers to reflect the Pacific student population at Unitec as well as the growing Pacific population of the wider Auckland community.





