### **UPDATE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL**



Welcome to the start of Semester One, 2021. Today we had planned to welcome our new and returning students on to Te Noho Kotahitanga Marae. But the announcement by Government last Saturday night that Auckland would move back to level 3 for at least seven days from Sunday, 28 February, means we have reverted to working remotely with teaching going online this week. There's a great Irish saying that covers our start to this teaching year: "It's not always the expected that happens.'

It's humbling to see how fast we've been to swing into gear this time - and with such care. Thank you all for your work in adapting our beginning of term to online experiences. We hope to be able to have our on-campus pōwhiri on Monday 15 March. Stay tuned!

Remote working has taught us some valuable lessons which will hold us in good stead for the rest of the year. 2020 reinforced the need to be agile, prepared and know our students well, their situations, and their needs. We need to have 'shadow' plans in place should we need to switch all our teaching and events online again. These things are all front of mind for each and every staff member in our School.

The key thing here is to keep all (but especially new) students connected to what's happening. There is more planning to do as we move through this phase of Lockdown, so please stay responsive. Thanks once again and kia kaha e te whanau. We can do this this (again)! It's not easy, and Mahi Kotahitanga and Ngākau Māhaki are clearly at the centre of what's happening across the School

It is also great to see progress being made on the facilities work at Building 108 which will be the new home for Design and Contemporary Arts and Screen Arts. Building 108 has been hidden under a cloak of scaffolding and plastic for four months now and construction is in full flight. Demolition works are 90% complete. The Infrastructure Operations team recently took members of the Creative Industries team on a walk-through of the building to show them the progress that has been made as well as a rare opportunity to take a walk on the roof. The Infrastructure Operations team is hosting walk throughs for staff over the coming weeks. I will share more news as it comes to hand.

In the meantime, we continue to be guided by Unitec's core values: Rangatiratanga - Authority and Responsibility, Wakaritenga - Legitimacy, Kaitiakitanga - Guardianship, Mahi Kotahitanga - Cooperation and Ngākau Māhaki - Respect. 
