# Meeting of Unitec Research Committee 8 April 2021

Title	Definition of Early Career Researcher at Unitec

#### Recommendation

That the committee considers and approves the amended definition of an Early Career Researcher (ECR) at Unitec.

#### **Purpose**

To create clarity, while being as inclusive as possible, for eligibility to access ECR funding.

### **Background**

The definition was discussed, amended and approved in February 2021, but when attempting to apply the definition, anomalies were disclosed.

The earlier agreed definition was:

An ECR at Unitec lies between 'emerging/beginner' and 'senior/advanced'. An ECR is within 10 years (prior to the closing date for full applications) of becoming an 'independent' researcher, which is defined as:

- A researcher who has completed a higher research qualification (a PhD, or Masters<sup>[1]</sup>);
  or
- 2. A researcher who was the first author of a disseminated quality assured research output<sup>[2]</sup>.

Time taken for parental leave<sup>[3]</sup> is not counted as part of the 10-year window (i.e. one year of parental leave would extend the eligibility period to 11 years since graduating).

#### The proposed definition is:

An ECR at United lies between 'emerging/beginner' and 'senior/advanced'. An ECR is within 10 years (prior to the closing date for full applications for ECR funding) of becoming an 'independent' researcher, which is defined as:

<sup>[2]</sup> This excludes conference presentations.

<sup>[3]</sup> Other forms of extended leave may be considered by negotiation with Tūāpapa Rangahau



- 1. A researcher who has been awarded a PhD or a professional doctorate with a significant research component; or
- 2. A researcher who has been the primary author of a disseminated quality assured research output. This criterion excludes conference presentations and typically also excludes very short written outputs.

Time taken for parental leave is not counted as part of the 10-year window (i.e. one year of parental leave would extend the eligibility period to 11 years since achieving criterion 1 or 2). Note that other forms of extended leave may be considered by negotiation with Tūāpapa Rangahau.

## **Next Steps**

Embed the reviewed definition in all Terms of Reference for ECR funding at Unitec.
