Unitec grad **Kiel McNaughton** directs TVNZ's latest Kiwi drama *Vegas* (starring: Katie Wolfe, Xavier Horan, Rena

Owen, Dean O'Gorman, Te Kohe Tuhaka, Miriama Smith) which debuts on TVNZ2 tonight, Monday, at 8.30pm). Filmed entirely in Rotorua, the \$6.4m budgeted, sixpart series is based on Ray Berard's 2015 novel *Inside the Black Horse*.

Senior lecturer Pedro Ramos Ilgenfritz da Silva, 48, is a Brazilianborn theatre practitioner, researcher and teacher, who celebrated 15 years working at Unitec this month.

He teaches both practical and theoretical papers at Unitec and is in charge of movement training for actors. He also teaches theatre history and theories of theatre. "I think the learning experience should give two things to the students: language and insight. That is what I strive in my teaching."

Pedro is proud to have been awarded lecturer of the year twice. In 2015 he started his PhD studies at University of Auckland which he hopes to finish this year.

Pedro's main highlights are theatre works created with the students; The Flying Jug (2008), Alfonsina (2009), One by One (2011 & 2013), 2063 (2015) and Leilani (2016). Pedro is married to Megan Smith and they have an eight-year-old daughter, Rosa. Currently residing in Hobsonville Point, Pedro loves to surf at the West Coast beaches.
