Unitec School of Creative Industries is celebrating recent success on the local and international film festival circuit. 2020 grad films Hysteria (wr/di: Amelia Jacobson) and Gin O'Clock (wr/di: Tilly Molloy) have both won Excellence Awards at this year's WRPN Women's International Film Festival (USA) while Pizza Girl (wr/di: Jesse Gibson) and Shadow (wr/di: Jack Knightbridge) received Exceptional Merit Awards. There was more success with Pizza Girl chosen for the Wairoa Maori Film Festival on 3-7 June.





Congratulations to Auckland artist and Unitec Contemporary Art lecturer, **Gina Ferguson** who won the top prize in the 2021 Fieldays No.8 Wire National Art Award in Hamilton last Thursday. The



\$7000 prize was awarded for her work Wear 'n' tear and its "stunning visual impact and inventive use of gorse, soap and wire." Judge, Virginia King: "Wear 'n' tear resonated with me on so many levels - the artist's thought-provoking concept and creative transformation of No.8 wire left me with a sense of intrigue," she said. The first national hui for Creative Industries tertiary educators took place at Unitec's Te Noho Kotahitangi marae last week for a multi-discipline discussion on navigating changes in the sector and a post-COVID future. More than 70 delegates from 24 vocational training institutes, ITPS and

industry organisations met to discuss how to better instigate and develop research to map the creative education ecosystem and workforce needs. Looking ahead to Our Creative **Industries Futures:** Purpose and Vitality Hui was initiated by **Dr** Vanessa Byrnes, Unitec's Head of School - Creative



Industries, and co-facilitated by Prof. Federico Freschi from Otago Polytechnic. "This is just the beginning of an ongoing discussion, but we hope it is the start of a collaborative framework for the industry. We finished agreeing there is strength in numbers, that we are better as a collaborative industry, and keen to involve all creative educators," says Dr Byrnes. Unitec dance lecturer and alumnus (2014) **Aloalii Tapu** and dance alumnae, **Tori Manley-Tapu** have produced *Etena* - six short films, sculpture, original music scores and writing through their arts company Ta'alili. The works imagine 'returning to paradise' alongside 'dystopia'. It projects what could be left in a post-apocalyptic Earth. As if growing and simultaneously melting, *Etena* re-imagines a crumbled existence. Guest artists include Unitec alumni **Jahra Wasasala**, **Faith Schuster** and **Tupua Tigafua**. Unitec acting grad (2018) **Kiri Naik** will appear on stage in *The Wairau Affray*, a play about the ill-fated attempt by Nelson colonists to confront Te Rauparaha and a party of his men at Tuamarina in 1843, in a dispute over ownership of the Wairau.
