Award. The award recognises a diverse range of Kiwis and friends of New Zealand who through the impact of their work, leadership and philanthropy raise New Zealand's mana globally. The founder and artistic director of iconic NZ dance company Black Grace was made an Arts Foundation Laureate in 2005. Ten years later he was awarded the title of Senior Pacific Artist at the Creative NZ Pasifika Arts Awards 2015. The following year he was appointed an Officer of the NZ
