Congratulations to Unitec acting alumna **Nastassia Wolfgramm** (2012) who is one of six recipients of the New Zealand Writers Guild's first round of Seed and



Seed Advanced for 2021. Seed is one of the most competitive writer-only grants for draft feature film scripts in New Zealand. This round received 151 total applications from writers around NZ. This fund is supported by the NZ Film Commission. Nastassia's submission entitled Chronicles of Polynesia/Tangi e Lupe (The Dove's Cry), set in Ancient Polynesia of a rivalry between warriors sets off a decade long revenge plan for a young Tongan orphan.
