SECTION 4 - WHAKAWHITI KŌRERO | ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

Section 4.1 **PBRF Quality Evaluation 2026 – Consultation on Panel-Specific Guidelines**

The committee reviewed the draft Panel-Specific Guidelines for the PBRF Quality Evaluation 2026. Each of the 14 PBRF peer-review panels have developed subject- and panel-specific advice and guidance that elaborates on the TEO and Assessment Guidelines. Members of the committee were urged to carefully consider the advice and guidance that pertains to the panel/s that they and the staff in their areas will submit their Evidence Portfolios to.

Action: Any feedback should be forwarded to Brenda Massey for collation before COB Wednesday, 1 November. Brenda will then convey the committee's collated feedback to the Rangahau Research Forum (RRF) via Megan Allardice (EIT).

The RRF will collate all responses from across Te Pūkenga and submit as a batch to the TEC. Alternatively individual submissions can be made until 5pm, 10 November via the TEC online survey.

SECTION 5 - NGĀ TUKUNGA | ITEMS TO RECEIVE

Section 5.1 Update: Rangahau and Research in Te Pūkenga

The committee discussed the update on rangahau and research provided as part of the Tārata te anamata | Creating our futures decision.

A new, nationally focussed Rangahau and Research Director role has been established and is currently being recruited for. The successful appointee will lead the design and consultation for rangahau and research in Te Pūkenga. The committee welcomed this as a positive development in the rangahau and research space.

In the meantime, research office kaimahi will be lifted and shifted into the Ako Delivery National Operations Directorate and Tūāpapa Rangahau is progressing with the promotion and roll out of various of its research support offerings for 2024 (including Masters Scholarships and the Early Career Researcher contestable funding round) and is continuing to support the operation of the committees it is responsible for, including UREC.

Section 5.2 NVivo Update

The committee noted the new process for postgraduate students and staff to obtain NVivo software licences.

Marcus Williams and Arun Deo have previously undertaken a significant piece of work to understand the demand for NVivo licences at Unitec and our licensing agreement now allows for up to 20 licences.

A couple of members of the committee have received feedback from staff in their areas that they had difficulty installing the software. It was queried whether Tūāpapa Rangahau could support staff with installation if required.

It was noted that Cynthia Almeida recently circulated step by step instructions to the supervisor's register about how to request access to, and install, NVivo. It was suggested that this communication also be disseminated to Research Leaders for their information and for distribution to staff who wish to obtain NVivo.

Action: Penny Thomson to communicate the new process for obtaining NVivo software licences and forward the NVivo installation instructions to Research Leaders. Marcus Williams and Arun Deo to determine how Tūāpapa Rangahau can support staff to install the software, if required, and include that in the communication.

SECTION 6 - KUPU WHAKAMUTUNGA | CLOSING

Section 6.1 Ētahi Kaupapa Anō | Any Other Business

The Chair reminded the committee of the upcoming Pacific Research Symposium, co-hosted by MIT and Unitec, and co-convened by Aiono Manu Fa'aea and Daisy Bentley-Gray. The call for registrations and abstracts is open now. The symposium will be held on Monday, 11 December. The Chair acknowledged Daisy's drive and commitment to bringing the symposium to fruition.

Daisy acknowledged Marcus Williams, Evangelia Papoutsaki and Tūāpapa Rangahau for their support of the symposium, which will provide a valuable opportunity for Pacific kaimahi who are actively engaged in, or wanting to engage in, research, and also non-Pacific kaimahi who are engaged in, or are wanting to engage in, Pacific research.

Symposiums of this nature are in many ways more valuable and effective than the annual Unitec/MIT Research Symposium, which is not being held this year. Tūāpapa Rangahau had noted an increasing reliance by staff on presenting at the Research Symposium in order to generate research outputs, despite these being non-quality assured. Symposia that are culturally or discipline specific often provide better opportunities for peer review and the inclusion of external participants relevant to the context, and generally do lead to the generation of quality assured outputs. The CITRENTZ conference hosted by the School of Computing, the Resilient and Responsible Architecture and Urbanism conference hosted by the School of Architecture and the opening of the new Toi o Wairaka gallery were cited as additional examples of discipline specific initiatives that have provided valuable opportunities for the dissemination of Unitec research this year.

An exercise has been undertaken to classify all 2023 agenda items according to:

- Whether they are Review Orientated (i.e., to do with compliance).

Key Points

In 2023 the Committee approved, received and/or discussed 43 agenda items (excluding items of general business, matters arising and standing items such as monthly self-assessment).

- 28 (65%) of these items were Strategically Orientated, e.g., responding to the TEC's consultations on the 2026 PBRF Quality Evaluation.
- 15 (35%) of these items were Review Orientated, e.g., receiving reports on internally funded research projects.
