UPDATES FROM W&S TEAM

Jo - Wellbeing and Safety Lead Rohe 1

- Your own wellbeing there is a lot going on around campus, in our lives and the world around us. A reminder to do something good for yourselves each day e.g. slow down, take a few moments to enjoy that coffee or walk in the sun, do something for you. Please remind your teams to the same.
- Wellbeing communications our wellbeing all staff communications are shared each month, please use the topics from this newsletter to talk about at your team meetings. This one featured a new app called SPARX. SPARX e-therapy gameplay equips young people and with life skills to power through stressful and negative emotions.

- Chemwatch is a hazardous substances/chemical inventory system. Currently we use an excel spreadsheet to track our hazardous substances. Some other Polytech's use this software including MIT, NorthTec and Otago. We are in the process of getting this to be available for Unitec and it will make it easier for our laboratories and all other areas that use chemicals. We are required to hold this list as part of our emergency preparedness.
- HUD Carrington development the Gate 3 road lighting is due to be completed. Transpower
 are connecting the last two lights and we will let you know as soon as they are working.

- Power boards one of the most common reasons for home fires is the multiplug/power boards. Read more about this here.
 - Power boards should only be used with low power appliances e.g. computers, printers, scanners, modems, phone chargers, televisions and stereos.
 - *Please do not use them* for heaters, dehumidifiers, electric jugs, washing machines and stoves as these appliances draw a heavy load of electricity.
- Kitchen appliances kaimahi are to use the appliances provided by Unitec in the kitchens, as
 opposed to bringing in their own appliances and setting these up in individual offices.

- Lighting the Marae work has been completed, the FM have been thanked for getting this work completed. Additional lighting on Clints way is on the maintenance list as well.
- o Cold and flu please stay at home if you have any cold or flu-like symptoms.

UPDATES FROM REPS

Lee-Anne Turton – ECE, Community Studies

- Leave tracking currently working on kaimahi wellbeing and this includes leave tracking.

- Entrance to 108 was not working when people were leaving the building so something must have happened to the door, however now rectified.
